The three temples were illuminated on Shyama Puja night and also on the next evening being Deepavali. SHYAMA PUJA

This year Shyama Puja was on 10th November and Diwali / Deepavali was on 11th November. But the enthusiasm of the devotees was no less than the earlier years. The residents of Chittaranjan Park pay special attention to perform Kalika Puja in Kali Mandir. Ladies and Gents keep day long fast, and they break their fast only at midnight after offering solemn Pushpanjali with flowers specially flown from Kolkata. The Mandir Complex, was therefore, full of Devotees on that day.



The entire Complex was illuminated aesthetically with twiny lights all round the three temples, tree tops and fountain area. Tche three Temples wore a gorgeous look with the new lighting design. The whole Complex looked like historic "Ayodhya", which celebrated the joyous return of "Ram, Laxman and Sita" from their exile.

Like previous years, this year also a short cultural programme was arranged before the commencement of

main puja. The artist was Tapas Roy, from Dakhineswar, who presented 1½ hour non-stop programme of devotional and shyama sangeet. His presentation was mesmerising and each song invited loud applause from the audience. Welcoming the audience, President and Secretary of Kali Mandir said that Durga Puja and Kali Puja are synonymous in the sense that it symbolises triumph of truth, righteousness and victory over evil. Their prayer to the Dieties were to give us enough strength and wisdom for emancipating the malice from our society and work for the well-being of our people for peace and harmonious living.

The holy Sankalpa was performed by the officials of KMS and the Puja started at 11.00 P.M. Systematic rituals were performed one by one religiously, for the convenience of the devotees, who preferred to sit in the adjacent lawn. Four Plasma TVs were installed so that minute to minute live telecasting of the rituals performed inside the Garva Griha could be seen from all corners, which was very much appreciated by the devotees. A divine ambience prevailed all round.

FIRE WORKS (Tubri) COMPETITION

On the eve of Sri Sri Deepavali Amabasaya Kalika Puja, popular tubri competition was held in the KMS complex on 9th November, 2015, drawing a large crowd. Prizes were awarded to the winners. This was followed by fireworks, to the delight of devotees and visitors.


